



Uintah County Election F.A.Q's

- 1) How do I know if I'm registered to vote? You can check online at vote.utah.gov or call the Uintah County Clerk-Auditor's office at 435-781-5360.
- 2) If I'm not registered, how do I register to vote? If your driver's license information is up to date you can register online at vote.utah.gov. If your information is not up to date, or you'd rather register in person, you can take a photo I.D. and proof of residence (i.e. a utility bill or piece of mail with your name on it) to the Uintah County Clerk-Auditor's office. You may also send in a mail in registration form prior to October 23rd. Registration forms can be found on vote.utah.gov.
- 3) Will I receive a ballot in the mail? Yes, all active registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail beginning October 13th.
- 4) How can I return my ballot? You may return your ballot by mailing it back in the yellow return envelope, by dropping it in a ballot drop box, or by bringing it directly into the County Clerk-Auditor's office.
- 5) Are mail in ballots really secure? Yes. Utah has a very secure system to ensure voting is handled safely and securely. However, if you are still unsure, feel free to drop your ballot off in a ballot drop box or to the County Clerk-Auditor's office. Doing so ensures that only you and election officials handle the ballot.
- 6) If I choose to vote in person where should I go? In person voting will be available during Early Vote from October 20th-30th from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and on Election Day (November 3rd) between 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. The County Building is the only polling location available (147 E Main, Vernal). You must bring the ballot that was mailed to you. Make sure you bring your I.D, proof of residency if needed.
- 7) Do you really check every signature? Yes. You will sign the yellow envelope that comes with your ballot. Your ballot must be returned in this envelope. EVERY signature is checked and verified to ensure

you are the one who voted your ballot. If we see a discrepancy, such as a signature that was forgotten or that did not match, we will contact you to come verify that the voted ballot is indeed yours.

8) What if there are multiple ballots in one envelope, does this mean multiple votes will be counted? No, we can only count one ballot per envelope and one ballot per person. Please make sure to place your ballot in your signed return envelope, if there is no ballot in the envelope we cannot count it.

9) Can I track my ballot, and how do I know that it has been counted? You can check the status of your ballot at vote.utah.gov

10) What should I do if I do not receive a ballot? Ballots will be mailed out on October 13th. If shortly after that date you still have not received a ballot in the mail, call or visit the County Clerk-Auditor's office. (435-781-5360)

11) Where will Drop Boxes be located? You can place your completed and signed return envelope in the ballot drop box located on the north side of the Uintah County Library (204 E. 100 N.) or in the Uintah County Building (147 E Main, Vernal). The drop box outside of the library is available 24 hours a day, and is under video surveillance. The ballots from these boxes are collected every week day and handled solely by election officials.

IMPORTANT DATES

October 13th: Beginning of Ballots being mailed

October 20th – 30th: Early Voting is available in the Clerk-Auditor's office.

October 23rd: Last day to register to vote.

November 3rd: Election Day

November 16th: Election Canvass
