The Uintah County Attorney's Victim Assistance Program is looking for compassionate people to act in the capacity of Volunteer Victim Assistants.

This position primarily involves Courtroom support and in-person contacts in conjunction with the Victim Services Coordinator. As a Volunteer Victim Assistant, you will play an important role in helping individuals through the Criminal Justice Process. Volunteers are a vital component to the advocacy grant and the growing success of our Advocacy Program.

No experience is necessary, but potential volunteers should have a willingness to learn and make a 1-year commitment. All applicants will be required to pass a background check. Volunteer Victim Assistants are also required to attend mandatory training each year which is covered by the grant. Volunteer hours will vary and will depend on the case load.
